


To all Pupils, Parents, Carers, Staff, Governors and Directors at Holy Cross Catholic Multi Academy Company Schools

Boasting a 600m2 'four court' sports area it also features generous storage and changing facilities as well as sufficient height for trampoline use! The students can't wait to start using the new facility!



Archdiocese Section 48 Inspections Success

This term we welcomed Diocesan inspectors to both St Augustine's and Cardinal Newman Catholic Schools to complete Section 48 Inspections. In addition to Ofsted Inspections all Catholic schools are subject to Section 48 Inspections that judge the standard of Catholic Life, RE and Collective Worship in schools. The Diocese appointed two inspectors for both schools to complete the inspections over two days.

As part of the process two inspectors interviewed pupils, staff and parents, visited lessons and assemblies, reviewed the standards of work in exercise books.

We are delighted that the inspectors were impressed with the high standards observed in both schools across all areas of school life.

St Augustine's was judged to be Good is all areas and Cardinal Newman Outstanding in all areas. A huge well done to both school communities on their wonderful Section 48 Reports.

Archdiocesan Vision for Education and Academy Strategy

On Thursday 17 March the Diocese wrote to all schools and Multi Academy Companies across the Diocese to inform them about the future vision for catholic education in the Archdiocese of Birmingham and their proposed families of schools.

The proposed future plan for our schools is to merge Holy Cross Catholic MAC with Romero and Holy Spirit MACs and form a new MAC with all the schools. In addition the remaining voluntary aided schools in Coventry would also join this new MAC.

The new academy would comprise of 4 Catholic secondary schools and 22 Catholic primary schools.

A working party will be formed to further investigate the proposal but there are no further details to share with you at this stage. We will keep parents updated when new information becomes available.



Management Information System Update – Arbor



We are excited to announce that over the last three weeks, our staff have been working hard on a new project to move away from our old Student Management Information System (SIMS) and onto a new platform called Arbor MIS.

Adopting Arbor will allow us to communicate with parents more efficiently and bring all the core school data and workflows into one system. This will mean you'll have one parent app for all the core functions such as making payments for dinner money and school trips, seeing your child's attendance and behaviour/achievements, responding to consent slips, assessments, reports and much more.

Our primary schools will all be going live with Arbor on Monday 25 April 2022 and as this project is so complex, we will be phasing out the functionality above to parents over the next half term. More information on how to register will come directly from your school after the Easter break so please look out for this information.

Our secondary schools will be starting their journey after Easter with the intentions of going live on Monday 5th September 2022. Again, we'll be phasing out the parent functions across the autumn term. This project is at the early stages and more information will be available in the summer term.

The outstanding piece of art by Katie O'Sullivan was designed by our Year 4 children, linking their new


learning and understanding of the FLOW project
