


# Green Heroes! Our Pupils Leading the Way in Litter-Picking!

## Parent Survey - May 2023 Feedback

A big thank you to all our parents and carers who took the time to complete our recent survey. There was lots of positive feedback as well as helpful comments about areas that parents felt could be improved. Headteachers from our schools will update parents

about actions taken in response to the individual school feedback.

We had 590 responses from parents across the MAC:

- 86% said they would recommend their school to another person
- 85% said their child was happy at school
- 87% said their child felt safe at school
- 83% said the school recognises when their child is working well
- 74% said they felt their school communicates well with parents
- 79% said the school ensures its pupils are well behaved
- 81% said the school has high expectations for their child

# Department for Education National School Rebuilding Programme

#### **School Rebuilds**


As previously shared we are ecstatic that both secondary schools in the Holy Cross Catholic MAC are being fully rebuilt under the new national School Rebuilding Programme. This exciting news means that Holy Cross Catholic MAC is one of only a handful of educational trusts in the country receiving more than one secondary school rebuild.

#### **Cardinal Newman**

The Cardinal Newman Catholic School rebuild has passed initial planning and the process to appoint the successful contractor will conclude shortly.

Detailed design work is now beginning with construction starting in early 2024 opening in late 2025. The recently built £4m canteen and dining block will, of course, be retained.

No designs have been agreed at this point but detailed 'cost control' designs have been drawn up for the procurement tender.



#### **Bishop Ullathorne**

We were delighted to learn recently that the Bishop Ullathorne Catholic School rebuild is in the next phase of projects in the national School Rebuilding Programme scheme.

Initial meetings are taking place this summer and we will update with projected timescales in the next MAC newsletter.



# HCCMAC Capital Works Update

#### **Bishop Ullathorne**

The Bishop Ullathorne new £4m Sports Hall is taking shape and on target for an August opening. The brand-new facility will house 4 badminton courts, indoor football, cricket nets, basketball hoops, trampolining and mats for gymnastics.

The new changing areas will be complemented with accessible provision and officials' changing areas for tournaments.







#### St Elizabeth's Hall Extension

The St Elizabeth's Hall extension project was completed in May providing essential additional learning space within the school. The additional space costing over £400,000 will link directly to the main hall and house a new Learning Resource Centre area as well as office space and storage.

Garden Organic will give you the know-how on home composting, seed sowing and organic growing, while Team Springboard will be arming you with seed bombs in a bid to boost biodiversity.
